




ROUTE 21 (RESERVOIR) AND ROUTE 22 (PONTIAC AVE.) ON DETOUR


Due to Rhode Island Department of Transportation (RIDOT) repairs to the Reservoir Avenue Bridge, RIPTA will detour Route 21



(Reservoir) and Route 22 (Pontiac Ave.) in the Providence/Cranston area. Route 21 and Route 22 detours began with the first trip on Monday, April 23, 2012, and will continue for approximately thirty days. Click here for details.

RIPTA DETOURS FOR AQUIDNECK ISLAND POLICE PARADE ON SUNDAY, MAY 6th

COX PROVIDENCE RHODE RACES RETURNS SUNDAY, MAY 6TH

RIPTA will detour eighteen bus routes in the Providence area on Sunday, May 6, 2012 in order to accommodate the Cox Providence Rhode Races. The detours will be in effect from

RIPTA AND CITY OF PROVIDENCE TO HOLD COMMUNITY MEETING ON PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS TO NORTH MAIN STREET

RIPTA and the City of Providence will hold a community meeting to present suggested transportation improvements along North Main Street. Route 99, which runs on North Main Street, is part of RIPTA's current Rapid Bus Project. RIPTA plans on implementing these improvements in a series of phases over the next two years. The meeting is scheduled for 6pm on Monday, May 14, 2012 at the Rochambeau Public Library, located at 708 Hope Street in Providence.

RIPTA is currently working with the City of Providence to improve the five highest ridership corridors in RIPTA's system: Broad Street, North Main Street, Elmwood Avenue, Chalkstone Avenue and Manton Avenue. Bus routes that serve these five corridors currently operate at a high frequency, 7 days a week, to meet passenger demand. Improvements to these larger key corridors will include traffic signal prioritization (only implemented on Broad & North Main currently), reconfiguration of bus stops, branding of key corridors, and improved passenger amenities at bus stops. The goals of this project are to improve bus performance and the overall passenger experience.

Community meetings such as these allow RIPTA to present proposed plans, as well collect valuable feedback from the public.

RIPTA will provide interpreter services for the deaf and hearing impaired, provided such a request is made at least 72 hours prior to the hearing date. A request for this service can be made in writing or by calling (401) 784-9500, x183.

RIPTA AND SENATOR JACK REED TEAM UP TO OFFER RHODE ISLANDERS WHEELCHAIR ACCESSIBLE TAXI SERVICE

Officials from RIPTA, Federal Transit Administration, Governor's Commission on Disabilities, Providence Warwick Convention & Visitors Bureau, and the State of Rhode Island joined U.S. Senator Jack Reed (D-RI) for a ribbon-cutting ceremony to officially celebrate the arrival of wheelchair accessible taxis in Rhode Island.

The ribbon cutting celebration took place in the PC Lounge of the Dunkin' Donuts Center located at 1 LaSalle Square in Providence on Friday, April 13, 2012 at 1:00pm. The new wheelchair accessible taxis will be on display at the location, with light refreshments for all guests following the ceremony.

Reed, a senior member of the Banking Committee, which oversees the Federal Transit Administration's New Freedom program, helped author legislation funding thirteen wheelchair accessible taxis for the state. RIPTA and the RI Division of Public Utilities and Carriers also provided support to help bring these vehicles to Rhode Island.

The New Freedom grant program seeks to reduce barriers to transportation services and expand the transportation mobility options available to people with disabilities beyond the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990.

Airport Taxi, Big Daddy Taxi, Corporate Taxi, Economy Cab, Orange Cab, Rainbow Cab and Valley Cab have purchased these new vehicles which will be on display at Friday's ceremony. The taxis will serve seventeen communities, including Providence, Newport and Woonsocket. T.F. Green Airport in Warwick will also be served. Standard Rhode Island taxi rates will apply to any service provided with these vehicles.
