SOLAR PANELS BOOST BUS BATTERIES

Thanks to the technology of a Warwick-based company, RIPTA's new, 2019 diesel buses are equipped with cost saving solar panels that boost vehicle battery life and performance. The panels,



manufactured by eNow Inc. of Warwick, use solar energy to enable bus batteries to perform better when the vehicles are started and also help the batteries maintain an optimum charge level through the day.

"This project is a win on many levels," said Scott Avedisian, RIPTA's Chief Executive Officer. "We are working with the state to introduce alternative energy sources into public transit and we're partnering with a Rhode Island company."

The panels were installed on 33 new diesel buses that are part of our regular fleet replacement as older buses are retired.


