# COMING SOON: A WAVE OF TECHNOLOGY

Starting this month, passengers are going to start seeing teal, rectangular boxes mounted near the dashboards of our buses, and may wonder, "What's that?"

The "boxes," which have a screen that promises "Coming Soon," are new card readers - called validators – that are going to make boarding the bus easier and faster for our customers. These validators will be able to read smart cards, scan digital codes on phone screens, and more. This new technology will allow us to offer



passengers a variety of fare products that they can just "tap and go" with when they board the bus. Our current fare boxes will still be in place for cash and existing fare products.

It's all part of our ongoing work to upgrade our fare collection system. Last year RIPTA announced that the contract for the project hand been awarded to INIT, Innovations In Transportation, Inc. of Virginia. The project will give passengers new ways to pay for bus fares, including online accounts, reusable smart cards,

mobile apps and the option of purchasing reloadable fare cards at hundreds of retail locations throughout the state.

There's more work to be done, so stay tuned!



# A GLIMPSE OF THE FUTURE!

We were at Quonset
Business Park recently for
the launch of the roadtesting phase of the state's
first autonomous vehicles.
The project, headed by the
Rhode Island Department
of Transportation (RIDOT),

will bring 12-passenger, electric, autonomous vehicles to the Olneyville section of Providence this spring. The "Little Roady" shuttles will travel on low-speed roads along a five-mile route along the Woonasquatucket River corridor. Working with RIDOT, we will get a first-hand look at this new and still-evolving technology, while also exploring how small autonomous vehicles might augment public transportation in the future.
