Passengers Must Pay Full Fare on R-Line Starting Today, October 1, 2023

RIPTA's R-Line fare free pilot program ended yesterday, September 30, 2023. Starting TODAY, October 1, 2023, R-Line passengers are required to pay the full fare, which is \$2 per boarding with cash or \$2 for one hour of unlimited rides with Wave. The farebox does not make change; riders must pay with exact change only.

Fare Free Paratransit RIde Service Ends

During the pilot program period, RIde paratransit service was free for passengers making trips that begin and end within 3/4 mile of the R-line. Starting today, October 1, 2023, paratransit passengers are required to pay the full fare, which is \$4 per trip.


