### **SUMMER SERVICE CHANGES**

RIPTA will implement summer service changes effective Saturday, June 18, 2022. RIPTA makes regular service adjustments three times a year in response to seasonal changes and/or passenger use. ### WEEKEND EXPRESS BEACH BUS IS BACK

Express South County Beach Buses serving Scarborough, Roger Wheeler and Galilee State Beaches will operate from the communities of Woonsocket, Central Falls, Pawtucket, Providence (Kennedy Plaza), North Providence and Cranston. ## RIPTA BREAKS GROUND ON IN-LINE CHARGING STATION

Last month, Governor Dan McKee joined state leaders and local officials to celebrate the groundbreaking of Rhode Island's first electric bus in-line charging



station. The station will be located along the R-Line, RIPTA's most frequent and highest-ridership route, connecting Providence and Pawtucket. RIPTA's first fully electric bus fleet will operate on this key corridor, lowering emissions in an

area where many low-income and BIPOC communities have been affected by air pollution.

"This new electric charging station is not only a key component in our battle against climate change, but an environmental justice tool as well, "said **Scott Avedisian, RIPTA CEO**. "Constructing this station at Broad City Line cements our commitment to reducing global carbon emissions, while improving air quality for transit-dependent communities burdened by the adverse health effects of pollution."

# PAWTUCKET/CENTRAL FALLS TRANSIT CENTER UPDATE

Construction continues at this intermodal transit center. At our site visit last week, construction workers were laying out a path of bright yellow square tiles with bumps. This detectable warning surface, known as tactile paving, helps people with visual impairments detect when they are about to leave a walkway, enter

a parking lot or street, or approach a transit boarding location.

Tactile paving was first developed in 1965 by Seiichi Miyake and has since been used worldwide to help the visually impaired safely navigate their way around cityscapes.
