TEMPORARY SERVICE REDUCTIONS DUE TO CRITICAL LABOR SHORTAGE

RIPTA is NOT eliminating any routes

RIPTA, like other transit agencies nationwide, is facing a critical shortage of staff necessary to maintain daily transportation service. With the ongoing shortage of bus drivers, we are forced to temporarily reduce service levels, beginning October 22, 2022. Once driver vacancies are filled, RIPTA will reinstate service levels as they are scheduled today.

Temporarily reducing service to match our current staffing levels means that riders will encounter fewer canceled trips as we will be able to run service truer to schedule.

Routes 17, 19, 21, 22, 27, 28, 31, 50, 51, 54, 55, 56, 57, 60, 63, 65X, 72, 87, and 92 will be affected. Click here to learn more about these reductions. Please note that early morning, night, weekend and holiday service has not been impacted.

RIPTA will also make changes to Routes 13, 29, 67 and 92 as part its annual fall service changes. RIPTA regularly makes service adjustments three times a

year in response to seasonal changes and/or passenger use.

RIPTA HELPS STUDENTS REACH STATE PROMISE FOR HIGHER EDUCATION

Several years ago, the state took a key step to removing



barriers to higher education by launching the Rhode Island Promise program, which offered free tuition to eligible students at the Community College of Rhode Island (CCRI). The promise continues, but students face more than just financial barriers to getting an education, including transportation access to their campuses. RIPTA has been essential in breaking that barrier.

A recent report by the independent Seldin/Haring-Smith Foundation in Washington, found that all CCRI campuses have a public transit stop within walking distance. RIPTA estimates that it serves nearly 400,000 community college students a year and will be expanding access to higher education with its plans to create a transit center on the community college campus in Warwick in order to give students express service to the University of Rhode Island in Kingston.

EAST SIDE TUNNEL IMPROVEMENTS

The East Side Tunnel is a critical piece of historic transit infrastructure connecting downtown Providence and Kennedy Plaza to the East Side and beyond. The tunnel was built in 1914 to aid the former trolley lines in climbing College Hill. Many of the buildings adjacent to the tunnel entrances, as well as

the locations of the bus stops and the shelter structure at the North Main Street entrance, have not changed in many years.

As RIPTA works to further expand and improve service to meet goals set in our Transit Forward RI 2040 plan, our amenities

and infrastructure need the ability to support more riders and more buses.

This East Side Tunnel project is intended to create safer pedestrian travel zones, full accessibility at bus stops, and improved passenger amenities while preserving the tunnel's historic architecture.

ELECTRIC BUS IN-LINE CHARGING STATION UPDATE

Earlier this summer, RIPTA broke ground on the state's first electric bus in-line charging station. This charging station will be located along the R-Line, RIPTA's most frequent and highest-ridership route, connecting Providence, Pawtucket and Cranston. The station, which can charge up to three electric buses simultaneously, will also feature driver restrooms and various site improvements including a snowmelt system.

Construction is well underway at the site. BOND Civil & Utility has cleared the area of debris and vegetation in preparation for this project. Rhode Island Energy recently installed a utility pole which will provide electricity to the charging station and a gas line which will heat the building and power the boilers that will support the snowmelt radiant heating system.

During Phase 2 - which starts this month - BOND will work on additional excavation, underground utility work, building the foundation, as well as underground work supporting the snowmelt radiant heating system.
