#### R-LINE IS FARE FREE!

Starting today, the R-Line, RIPTA's most frequent and highest-ridership route, connecting Providence and Pawtucket is FARE FREE for one year! This free fare pilot program is exclusively for R-Line passengers. Passengers traveling on all other routes are required to pay the full fare.

During the pilot program period, paratransit service will also be fare free for passengers making trips that begin and end within 3/4 mile of the R-line.

"We want to thank the Senate for this funding opportunity which will allow us to learn what free fare programs may mean for public transportation," said **Scott Avedisian**, **RIPTA's Chief Executive Officer**. "This pilot will give more people an opportunity to ride our busiest route, the R-Line, which connects Cranston, Providence, and Pawtucket. This project complements our ongoing free fare

pilot program in Central Falls, and together these initiatives will guide fare discussions in the future. We look forward to sharing the findings with our elected officials in order to ensure continued growth of ridership on RIPTA and sustainable public transportation for our state."

## NEW FLYER FLEET UNVEILED

Governor Daniel J. McKee and members of the State's Congressional delegation joined RIPTA last month in unveiling Rhode Island's first electric bus fleet. RIPTA has received the first of fourteen (14) New Flyer Xcelsior CHARGE NG™ forty-foot battery-electric buses, with the remainder of the Authority's

order to be delivered in the upcoming months. This fleet of New Flyer Xcelsior electric buses will replace the current fleet of diesel buses that operate on the R-Line, RIPTA's most frequent and highest-ridership route, connecting Providence and Pawtucket.

"The arrival of these New Flyer electric buses demonstrates RIPTA's commitment to mitigating climate change and contributing to a zero-emission future," said **Scott Avedisian**, **RIPTA CEO**. "These electric buses are yet another example of how public transportation can help achieve cleaner air quality. We already know that using public transportation as opposed to single

occupancy vehicles is beneficial to our environment. Switching to electric buses only furthers the benefits of using public transportation."
